The following projects are the priorities that have been identified by the Board of Education of the Redlands Unified School District, and are proposed to be financed. Projects may be enhanced, supplemented or expanded to the extent unexpected funds are available for such projects from non-bond sources.

REDLANDS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENT BOND OF 2008 BOND PROJECT LIST

Proceeds from the sale of bonds authorized by this proposition shall be used only for the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, or replacement of school facilities, including the furnishing and equipping of school facilities, as specified in the following Bond Project List, and not for any other purpose, including teacher and administrator salaries and other school operating expenses.

COMPLETION OF CITRUS VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL

Completion of the construction, furnishing and equipping of Citrus Valley High School to house approximately 2,600 students, including:

- Associated site development and offsite and other improvements made necessary by construction of such facilities
- Planning, designing and constructing the high school and related facilities.
- Acquisition and installation of furnishings and equipment, including technology equipment, related to the newly constructed facilities

SAFETY AND SECURITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

To meet the District's priority of providing a safe and secure environment for students, staff, and other users of school facilities, the following safety and security improvement projects are proposed to be financed at the following schools sites, as needed:
